Q: Can you give us a brief overview of your company or organization?

Trout is a Christian camp in northern Minnesota. Our mission is to engage children, youth, and adults with the life-changing message of Jesus Christ by creating unique camp opportunities and learning experiences in which our words, our service, and our personal relationships capture and communicate the essence of the gospel.

Q: Are there both internships and full-time job opportunities?

We are looking for college students to fill several summer jobs, such as Cabin Leaders, Lifeguards, Program Staff, Office Specialists, Food Service, Housekeeping, and more. Base pay starts at \$350/week (housing and food included). Many of our jobs meet the criteria for summer internships or we can work with students to fulfill those requirements. Trout also offers a gap year internship program for anyone who wants to learn more about camping ministry in more depth or develop leadership skills.

Q: Are there any specific majors you are particularly interested in hiring?

You may find our opportunities most interesting if you are studying anything in the fields of education, music, ministry, or social work, but we hire students in any major who want to spend a summer serving God in a unique way.

Q: What do you look for in a student or new graduate applying to work with you?

Most importantly, we look for staff that are excited about the gospel and passionate about sharing the love of Jesus with others. Our staff should be ready to be challenged to grow in their faith and leadership skills, as well as be flexible in the midst of a changing schedule.

Q: What's one thing that makes your company/org amazing to work for?

Trout values age-specific programming, so all of our campers experience camp and hear the Gospel in the way that makes the most sense to them. Our summer staff are such a key part of the ministry, so you get a lot of opportunities to take ownership of camp and be part of a positive faith community. Our hope is that while you serve campers, you also grow closer to God and learn marketable skills that will help you in the future. It's also pretty cool that some of our campers live in a castle and treehouses!
