Internships

When is the best time to start looking for an internship? With your long list of school obligations and responsibilities it is best to plan out your internship search in advance so you have adequate time to research, apply, and secure an internship!

Timing is very important when looking for an internship opportunity. Depending on the type of internship you would like, you may be able to begin applying for a summer internship as early as the fall semester. Larger companies, and more competitive internships, typically have an earlier deadline. If you are applying for an internship with a smaller company, usually 3-6 months is enough time to search, apply, interview, and obtain an internship; but we encourage students to start doing preliminary research during the fall semester to determine if any internships you are interested in have early application deadlines. Talk to your professors to see if they have any unique tips for finding an internship within your intended field or industry. The fall is also the perfect time to edit and fine tune your resume so it is ready to be sent out as soon as internship applications are open. 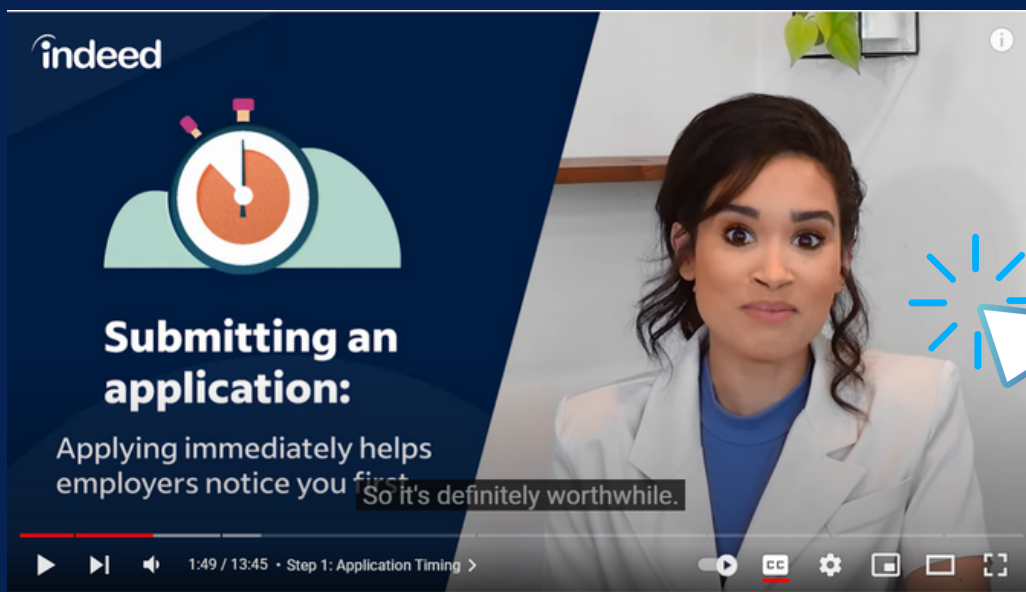
