If you are considering getting married (or changing marital status) and have not yet completed your 2022-2023 FAFSA, be sure to talk with a financial aid counselor BEFORE submitting your FAFSA.

Students do not always receive a better financial aid package because they are married. A financial aid counselor can advise you on whether it is best to complete the FAFSA before getting married (and receive aid as a single student) or wait to submit the FAFSA until after you are married (and receive financial aid as a married independent student). To determine which option is best for you, please visit ohe.state.mn.us and select Paying for College and “Financial Aid Estimator.” You will need to complete two estimates, one as a single student (include parents’ data) and one as a married independent student (include spouse’s data).

Note: Some changes in marital status **may** be allowed after your FAFSA has been completed (see below), but these are reviewed on a case-by-case basis based on a variety of factors, including a determination of which status best reflects your ability to pay. If you are planning to get married (or expect any change in marital status), be sure to talk with the financial aid office **prior** to completing your FAFSA to ensure that you receive the best financial aid package.

If you select this option, please complete the following steps:

1. Log onto **FAFSA.gov** and correct your marital status to show that you are “Married.”
(This will cause a reject code to appear on your FAFSA that requires a financial aid counselor to override.)
2. Submit the following documents to the Bethel financial aid office:
 - a. Copy of your Marriage Certificate
 - b. Completed, signed paper 2022-2023 FAFSA (available at: <https://fafsa.ed.gov/options.htm>)
 - c. 2022-23 Household Size Confirmation form (Request from Financial Aid Office)
 - d. 2020 Tax Return Transcripts for **you and your spouse**
(Visit irs.gov or call 1-800-908-9946 to request 2020 tax return transcript from the IRS)

- e. If you did not file a 2020 federal tax return, submit all 2020 W-2's for **you and your spouse** and 2020 non-filing letter from the IRS for **you and your spouse**
- f. This completed appeal form

If you select this option, please complete the following steps:

1. Log onto **FAFSA.gov** and correct your marital status to reflect your current marital status. *(This will cause a reject code to appear on your FAFSA that requires a financial aid counselor to override.)*
2. Submit the following documents to the Bethel financial aid office:
 - a. Documentation of change in marital status (e.g. divorce paperwork)
 - b. Completed, signed paper 2022-2023 FAFSA *(available at: <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa/filling-out#options>)*
 - c. Verification Documentation (see options below):
 - i. If the FAFSA requires parent information, submit the following documents:
 1. Household Size Confirmation form *(Request from Financial Aid Office)*
 2. 2020 Tax Return Transcript for student and parents
(Visit irs.gov or call 1-800-908-9946 to request 2020 tax return transcripts from the IRS)
 3. All 2020 W-2's for student and parents
 - ii. If the FAFSA does not require parent information, submit the following documents
 1. Independent Verification Worksheet
 2. 2020 Tax Return Transcript for student
(Visit irs.gov or call 1-800-908-9946 to request 2020 tax return transcripts from the IRS)
 3. All 2020 W-2's for student if you did not file a 2020 federal tax return
 - d. This completed appeal form.
