2019-2020 — College of Adult & Professional Studies (CAPS) **Frogtown Summit-University Grant Agreement**



College of Adult & Professional Studies (CAPS) students who live in the Frogtown/Summit-University (FSU) neighborhood may apply for Bethel's FSU Grant each year.

The amount of the FSU grant varies depending on the number of credits attempted, and the amount of Federal Pell Grant and Minnesota State Grant and Employer Tuition Reimbursement received. The sum of Pell, Minnesota State Grant, Employer Reimbursement, and FSU Grant will not exceed the semester's tuition. The maximum FSU Grant is \$1,700/semester. Recipients of this scholarship are not eligible for other Bethel funded grants or scholarships.

INSTRUCTIONS

Within 30 days of the start of the term for which the applicant hopes to receive the FSU grant, students must submit all of the following (note: these documents must be resubmitted each academic year):

- This 2019-2020 FSU Grant Agreement
- Current proof of residence within the FSU neighborhood (e.g. copy of home phone bill, utility statement)
- The 2019-2020 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid; FAFSA.gov)

Recipients must meet all of the following criteria:

- Must be admitted as a degree-seeking student in the College of Adult & Professional Studies.
- Must live in the Frogtown/Summit-University neighborhood for at least 3 months prior to enrolling (see map on reverse).
- First-time recipients **must** have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$10,000 or less (from FAFSA).
- Must not have earned a bachelor's degree.
- Must not be in default on any student loans.
- Must be enrolled for at least six (6) credits per term.
- Must demonstrate satisfactory academic progress by maintaining at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point average and successfully completing at least 67% of all attempted courses.

Renewability of FSU Grant

- Students who move out of the FSU neighborhood during an academic year forfeit their FSU Grant for the subsequent academic year.
- Students must continue to demonstrate financial need (students renewing their FSU grant must maintain an EFC of \$15,000 or less).
- The amount of the FSU Grant is reviewed and may be adjusted annually.
