BUDGET AND FINANCIAL DATA

The fringe benefits rate for stipends and summer salary at Bethel University is currently **14%**. This rate includes FICA and retirement contributions. The benefits rate for other salary is **29.60%**. This rate includes FICA, retirement, health insurance dental; insurance, life insurance, and long-term disability. We anticipate a 2% increase per year for each of these fringe benefits rate.

Summer Salary (Faculty): Summer salary per month cannot exceed the base monthly salary for the academic year.

Release Time for Faculty: Must use actual salary.

Stipends: Varies.

Student Salary Rates: \$10.50 to \$14.75/hour but may vary. Check with Human Resources:

Undergraduate Student Research Rates: \$10.00 to \$13.00/hour but may vary.

Indirect Cost Rate: Our negotiated rate with the Federal Government for Facilities and Administrative Costs (F and A) is 54%. This applies solely to direct salaries and wages including all fringe benefits.

Fringe Benefit Rates: These rates may change every year; be sure to use up-to-date number. Rates below are for the 2021–2022 academic year.

- Course Release for Faculty (TEUs) = 29.60%
- Salary for Staff = 29.60%
- Summer Salary/Stipends = 14.00%
