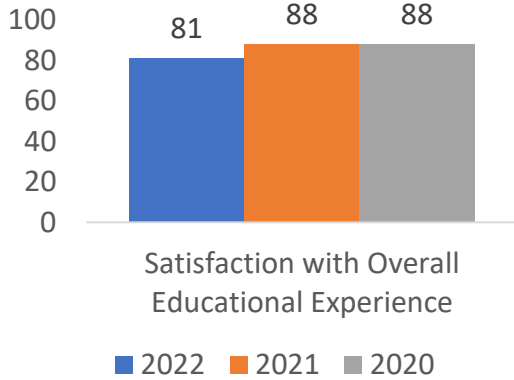
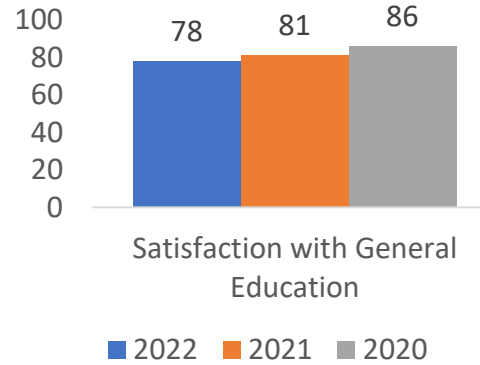




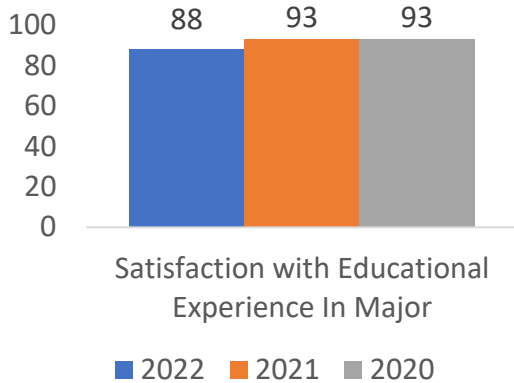
CAS Alumni Survey Results: Academics



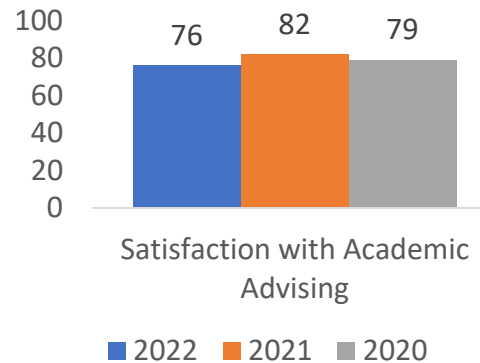
This item is seen as a “bellwether” for an educational institution. The 2022 satisfaction rating is the lowest it has been on an alumni survey.



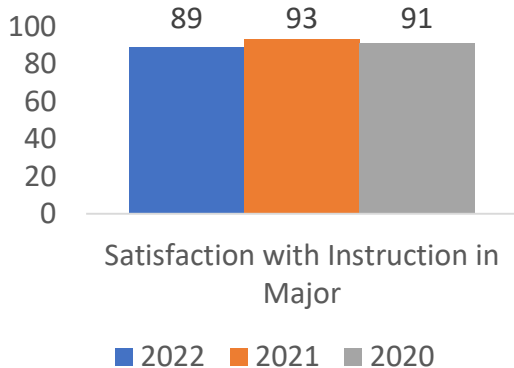
Although we have seen a decrease in satisfaction with General Education, alumni are consistently more satisfied with their General Education experience than current students (67%). This may be because alumni begin to appreciate the Gen Ed experience more after Bethel.



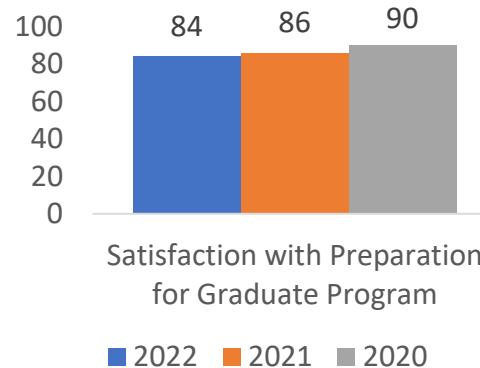
Alumni (and current students) give the highest satisfaction ratings to the educational experiences in their major, including instruction.



Satisfaction with advising has increased for current students.



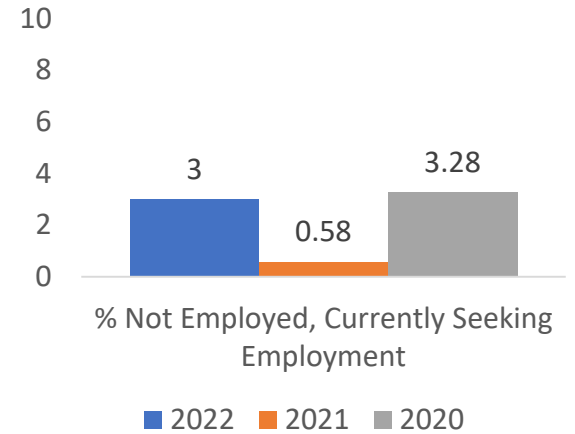
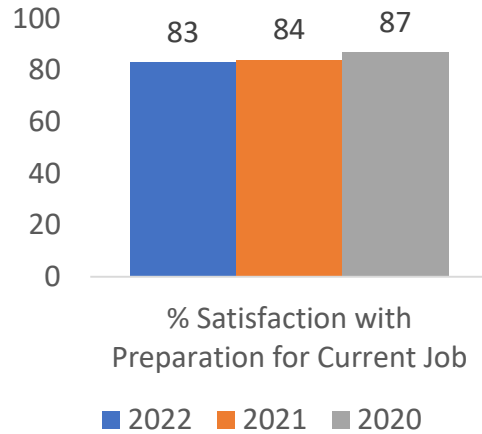
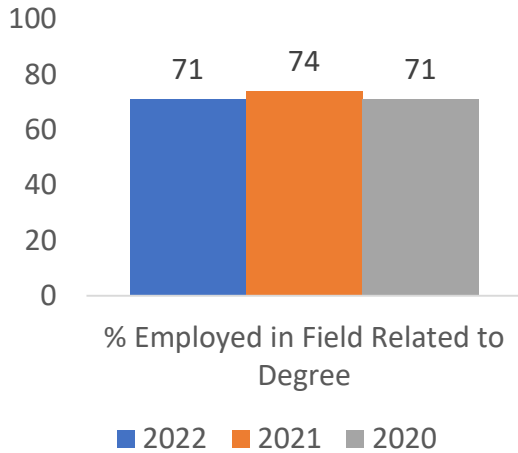
**All charts represent percent at least somewhat satisfied. Vast majority are satisfied or very satisfied.*



Alumni who have gone on to graduate school have consistently been satisfied with how their Bethel education prepares them for their graduate program



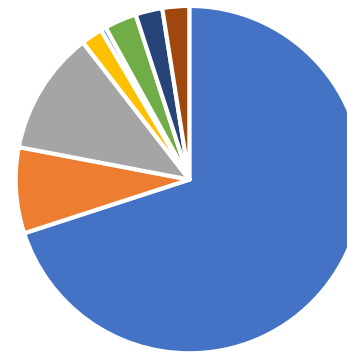
CAS Alumni Survey Results: Careers & Activity After Bethel



The percentage of alumni not employed and seeking employment has always been very low at Bethel. This year it is a little surprising that it was at 3% given how historically low unemployment is in the state of Minnesota and nationally.

We have strong satisfaction with how the educational experience at Bethel has prepared alumni for their current job.

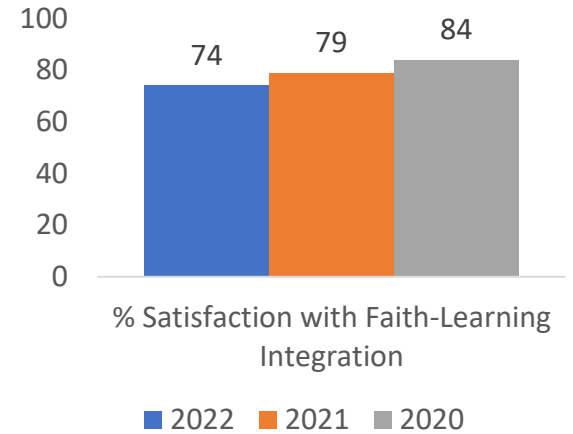
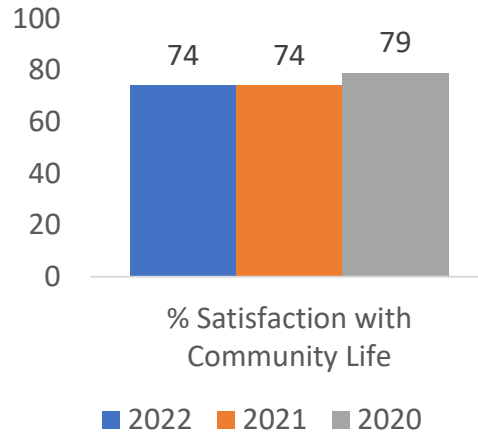
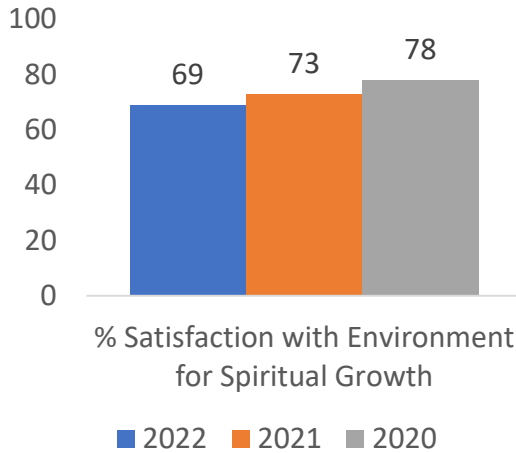

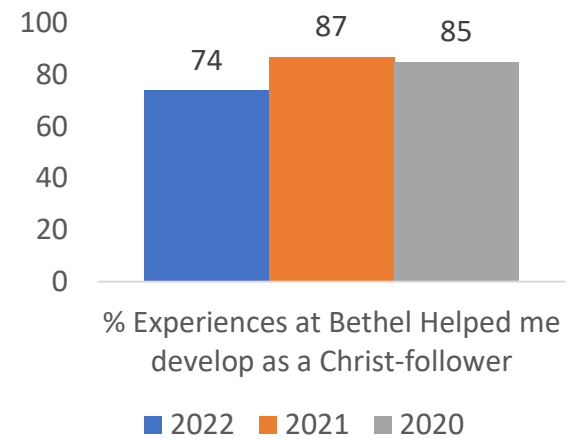
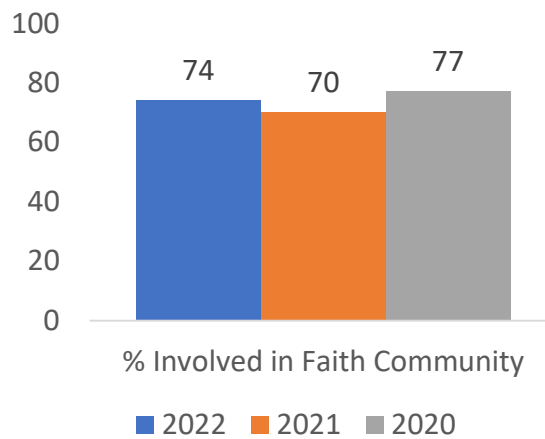


CAS Alumni Survey Results: Faith & Spirituality



The downward trends in satisfaction with “Bethel’s environment to help in your spiritual growth” and “faith-learning integration in courses in major” are concerning. However, we have not seen a decrease in these satisfaction ratings with current students.

About $\frac{3}{4}$ of alumni indicate that they are involved in a faith community. Those who do participate tend to attend church frequently (92% report attending at least 2-3 times a month).
