# **Bethel University 2021-22 All Year Student Enrollment**

### **Enrollment:**

A total of 4,707 unduplicated students registered for classes at Bethel University during the 2021-22 academic year (fall 2021 through summer 2022), a decrease in enrollment of 5.2% from the prior year's enrollment. The decrease was due to the continuing COVID pandemic, the closure of the San Diego seminary location (BSSD, down an additional 77.4%), as well as, decreases in enrollment experienced by the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS, down 4.2%), the Graduate School (GS, down 8.5%), and the St. Paul seminary (BSSP, down 6.6%). In contrast, College of Adult & Professional Studies (CAPS, up 1.0%) experienced an increase in enrollment due to the expanded PSEO program, as well as increased recruitment efforts.

College in the Schools (CIS) enrollment has fluctuated between 147 and 185 over the last 8 years and increased to 388 during the 2021-22 academic year. Given that these students are not a part of the CAS population (they are taught by high school teachers in high schools for Bethel credit), they continue to be reported separately from CAS enrollment figures.



Twenty-seven students were enrolled in more than one school, as follows. These students could be enrolled concurrently in more than one school (e.g. "dual enrollment") or sequentially (e.g. finish an undergraduate degree in the fall, and continue to graduate school in the spring). This metric has declined during the pandemic.



Total duplicated enrollment at Bethel University for 2021-22 was 5,007. (This counts each student once for each school in which they were enrolled).




### **Gender:**

Gender balance for 2021-22 was 63.0% female, down slightly from the 63.8% female the year before. While CAS showed a decrease from 60.6% to 59.0%, in female enrollment, CAPS and GS showed small increases in the percentage of enrolled females. BSSP displayed a larger increase in enrolled females from 44.9% to 47.2%. BSSD females experienced another increase from 83.9% of the population to 100%, likely due to BSSD only educating the remaining teach-out students studying Marital & Family Therapy.




# Age:

CAS continues to maintain a median age of 20, with about 96% of students being under the age of 25. Median ages for the remainder of the schools are in the upper 20's to the upper 30's. At a median age of 28 (down from 31 in the previous year), CAPS is the site with the youngest population after CAS.




# Race/Ethnicity:

The percent of students of color at all Bethel schools increased from 19.9% in 2020-21 to 20.7% of students with a known race/ethnicity (excluding non-resident aliens).




The overall increase in racial and ethnic diversity at the university (excluding non-resident aliens) was driven by increases in CAPS (up from 30.3% to 32.9%) and GS (up from 17.0% to 17.9%). CAS diversity displayed another increase, growing from 17.2% to 18.1% largely attributed to the continuation of the ActSix program, the strong retention of its participants as well as an increased focus on overall enrollment of student so color.



### **Credit Levels:**

Total registered credits for the entire university fell 9% from the prior year. CAPS experienced a 3% decrease in credits after experiencing a 20.8% increase in credits the previous year primarily due to the shift of Maranantha PSEO students from CAPS to CAS. In CAS, the 8% decrease in registered credits was driven primarily by decreased enrollment assumed to be partially related to the lingering COVID pandemic, with average credits per student remaining stable. BSSP's median credit level decreased from 11.0 to 10.0 and the overall registered credits were 11% lower than the previous year. There was a decrease in overall credits at the seminary due to the decrease in enrollment at BSSD and the COVID pandemic.



Please note that zero credit students are most often SMEP (music) students in CAS and either master's thesis or doctoral dissertation continuation students in GS, BSSP and BSSD.

# **State and Country:**

In 2021-22, Bethel University enrolled students from 50 states and 10 foreign countries. The state with the largest contingent of Bethel students continues to be Minnesota (74.9% of all enrollment), followed by Wisconsin (4.3%), California (1.9%), Iowa (1.5%), Illinois (1.4%), and South Dakota (1.2%) with similar percentages to prior years in these states.

#### **Marital Status:**

Marital status is no longer thoroughly collected and recorded for a majority of Bethel University students with increasing unknown statuses in CAS, CAPS and GS. Detail can be found in the appendix of this report.

### **Denomination:**

The percentage of Bethel University students affiliated with Converge Worldwide decreased from 11.9% in 2020-21 to 10.6% in 2021-22. While there has been a 10-year trend downward from nearly 25% in 2007-08, there is evidence we have reached a plateau. Some of the drop may be attributed to the fact students do not necessarily know the denomination of the church they attend. Affiliation with Lutheran and Catholic denominations have surpassed that of Converge Worldwide, with 19.8% identifying as Lutheran and 11.2% identifying as Catholic. The total number of students who identify as "Baptist" is 22.6%.
