4. A course in ethical decision making must be included within the total program. Recommended: PHI 110 Contemporary Moral Issues. Approved alternates: ENS 335K and PHI 335K Environmental Ethics, GES 340K Healthcare Informatics: Merging Data, Science, Technology, and Healthcare, GES 390K Decision-Making and Medical Technology, GES 405P Ethical Relationships: Choosing the Good in Family and Community Life, GES 420P Bioethics, and GES 458PZ Contemporary Wellbeing and Traditional Therapies in Taiwan.

5. One general education biblical studies course is required as a prerequisite course for entry into the Nursing Program. Choices include BIB 101 Introduction to the Bible, THE 201 Christian Theology, or Interpreting Biblical Themes (J) course.

This program assumes a student will use CHE 101/CHE 101D and NUR 425GZ to meet the general education Laboratory Science and Comparative systems requirements.

Most financial aid packages stipulate 12 credits/semester; Minnesota state grants are reduced when credit load falls below 15 credits/semester. (Interim credits may be split between fall and spring for state grant purposes only.)
