Students seeking licensure in the State of Minnesota in a world language who are not native-speakers of that language are required to demonstrate Intermediate - High level speaking proficiency as defined by ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines. Students are required to have an extended immersion experience in a country where their language of study is the primary language. Upon return, they are required to demonstrate proficiency on the ACTFL OPIC. Most financial aid packages stipulate 12 credits/semester; Minnesota state grants are reduced when credit load falls below 15 credits/semester. (Interim credits may be split between fall and spring for state grant purposes only.)
