3. All written testimony—including comments faxed or submitted as email attachments—must include the commenter's name, address, telephone contact information, and the commenter's relationship to the program for Accreditation staff to verify the source of the testimony.
4. All comments must be signed.
5. Comments that do not meet these requirements will not be considered, and the individual or group commenting will be notified.
